Do the Packaging & WEEE Regulations affect you?

Every year the UK throws away many millions of tonnes of waste packaging and electronic equipment. They are the fastest growing waste streams in the UK and the EU. To address this situation businesses need to comply with the Packaging Regulations and the Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) regulations.

The Packaging Regulations apply to companies who handle 50 tonnes or more of packaging and have a turnover of over £2 million. The WEEE regulations apply to all companies who import, manufacture or re-brand electrical and electronic equipment (EEE) for the UK market. WEEE regulations also apply to retailers and distributors of EEE.

Businesses not complying with these regulations are at risk of prosecution. Additionally, compliance can also result in greater resource efficiency and therefore profitability.

The Environment Agency is hosting two events to explain the implications of these regulations and how to get help.
